

Jeremy Hitchcock, of Manchester, NH is best known in NH for founding Dyn, an Internet infrastructure company connecting people, content, and commerce. Hitchcock created the company in 2001 while a student at Worcester Polytechnic Institute. Dyn grew from dynamic DNS to data, analytics, and traffic routing, handling 20% of the Fortune 500 and Alexa 1000 traffic. After growing the company to 500 employees and customers across six continents, achieving \$100 million of ARR (accounting rate of return), and raising \$100 million of growth capital, Hitchcock stepped down as CEO in 2016. The company was acquired by Oracle in 2017.

In 2017, Hitchcock started Minim, an IoT networking and security company.

Hitchcock has been recognized as Ernst and Young Entrepreneur of the Year (northeast), Inc. 500 and Deloitte Fast 500 rankings, and many best company to work for accolades. He has been featured in or written for the Wall Street Journal, Washington Post, Forbes, Inc. Magazine, VentureBeat, Politico, and The Boston Globe. Topics have included building entrepreneurial ecosystems, running a bootstrapped and hyper-growth company, developing a talent pipeline, and managing the culture of companies.

For his efforts in workforce development, he received an honorary doctorate from the University System of New Hampshire. In addition to serving as a CCSNH trustee, Hitchcock is also a trustee of Worcester Polytechnic Institute, his alma mater.

Hitchcock graduated from Worcester Polytechnic Institute with a B.S. in Management Information Systems. He and his wife Elizabeth have been active in educational and philanthropic causes, including New Hampshire Institute of Art and Worcester Polytechnic Institute. In 2017 they opened an independent bookstore in downtown Manchester, NH.
